

Cook County Budget at a Glance



- FY2011 budget = \$3,055,100,00
 - FY2010 budget = \$3,056,586,488 (subtracting 2010 capital programs)
- 2011/2010 Change = (\$1,486,488.00)
- Cook County has approximately 23,260 employees
- 2011/2010 Change = (631 employees)
- The four main functions of the County are:
 - Public Health
 - Public Safety
 - Tax and Real Estate Administration
 - Cook County Forest Preserve (under separate budget)











77.9% - Personal Services

7.9% - Contractual Services

 Accounts that are used to make payments for services that can only be preformed by persons or companies with specialized skills and knowledge

6.3% - Supplies and Materials

 Accounts that are used for purchases of consumables, items of equipment with a unit cost of less than \$500, which are considered supplies and not capital equipment

7.5% - Operations, Maintenance, Contingency and Special Purpose

- This category includes accounts established to provide funds for general expenses, special programs and other expenses which fluctuate each fiscal year and require contingent funding.
- Purchases or expenses related to the operation and maintenance of facilities, office equipment, automotive, road repair equipment and all other plant or institutional equipment

0.4% - Rental and Leasing

 Accounts under this category are used for payments related to the rental or leasing of automotive, institutional, medical and office equipment and rental of offices or other facilities as required by various departments of the County.








The Public Health System

- The Cook County Health and Hospital system comprises 30% of the County budget or \$911 million and supports:
 - The flagship hospital of John H. Stroger Jr. and the satellite hospital of Provident in Hyde Park.
 - In 2011 Oak Forest Hospital was transitioned into a regional outpatient clinic with a 24-hour urgent care center.
 - 16 county run clinics that provide primary and specialty care to patients in communities throughout the County.
 - The Department of Public Health which provides public health programs, services and education
 - Cermak Health Services, providing comprehensive health care to the nearly 100,000 men and women that enter the Cook County Jail each year.
 - JTDC Health Services, providing comprehensive primary care as well as mental and dental health care to the 7,000 children that enter the Juvenile Temporary Detention Center each year.
 - The Ruth Rothstein CORE Center, a national model for the care for the patients with HIV/AIDS and other related infectious diseases.

- The public safety fund comprises 41%, or over \$1.2 billion, of the Cook County Budget and supports the largest single site jail complex and the second largest unified Court system in the nation.
 - Sheriff, the Chief Judge, the State's Attorney, Public Defender, and the Clerk of the Circuit Court are the major users represented under this fund
- The Sheriff is responsible for running the largest single site jail in the Country
 - Nearly 100,000 people cycle through the Cook County jail each year
 - There are approximately 9,000 detainees in the Cook County Jail at any given time
- The State's Attorney represents the County in all civil litigation against the County
- The Cook County Public Defender provides free legal counsel to those who are charged with a criminal offense who
 are unable to afford private representation.
- The Chief Judge's Office is responsible for the administration of the Circuit Court of Cook County, which is part of the state judiciary branch. The Chief Judge oversees approximately 400 judges and an additional 2,700 nonjudicial employees
- The Clerk of the Circuit Court is charged with keeping all of the records for the Circuit Court of Cook County including civil, criminal, traffic, and juvenile cases.



Administration and General Taxing Bodies




- The Corporate Fund comprises 5.5%, or about \$169 million of the Cook County Budget.
 - This fund supports the general government management and support services for the County.
 - Includes financial oversight and reporting functions, payment of bills and contract awards, economic and human development, the maintenance of highways, environmental monitoring and control, homeland security coordination, capital planning and policy.
 - This fund also supports the assessment, administration and collection of the property tax, sales tax, and various fees including:
 - The Cook County Assessor who is responsible for assessing the value of each of the 1.8 million parcels of property in Cook County.
 - The Cook County Board of Review is responsible for hearing citizen's appeals of the property tax assessment made by the Assessor.
 - The Cook County Treasurer is the County's banker, responsible for mailing the tax bills, collecting the taxes on those parcels of real property and distributing the revenue throughout the County.
 - The Cook County Recorder of Deeds maintains the land records for the County including records of all real estate transactions.
 - The Cook County Clerk maintains all of the County records and books including birth, death and marriage records.

Where does the County Sales Tax go?



Capital Improvement




- President Preckwinkle issued Executive Order No. 2010-1 on December 13, 2010, placing a moratorium on all non-essential capital projects in the planning or design phase. This allowed for the review of more than 245 previously approved projects, with budgets valued at approximately \$571 million.
- The moratorium resulted in a thorough analysis of projects and current available funding. This analysis allowed Cook County to plan for the use of unspent bond proceeds from of approximately \$300 million from bonds issued in 2009 and 2010 for previously approved capital projects. These unspent bond proceeds will be sufficient to cover planned CIP expenditures in 2011 and into 2012. This proposed CIP allows Cook County to proceed with a program that focuses on critical needs, strategic program initiatives, facility utilization realignment, and real estate disposition as appropriate. No additional funding is required for 2011.
